The fast track Professional Sail Training (PST) course is designed to progress an inexperienced sailor to a fully qualified professional standard.

Hamble School of Yachting follows the globallyrecognised RYA certification programme and graduates of the PST course will be qualified to commercially endorsed RYA Yachtmaster Offshore level - the gold standard in sailing qualifications.

The PST course is also a great option for anyone looking for a life-changing experience; either following retirement, during a gap year, sabbatical or taking leisure sailing to the next level.

THE HAMBLE STANDARD

Led by Principal Dave Robson and his knowledgeable team, Hamble School of Yachting specialises in delivering the very highest standard of training focused on a future career or cruising success, not solely on successfully passing the Royal Yachting Association (RYA) Yachtmaster assessment. Whilst a PST graduate with little prior experience should be aware of their limited years at sea, it is nonetheless likely that they will be as competent a yacht skipper and sailor as another who, with potentially more sea miles, has not benefited from such a focused, intensive training programme.

WHO ELSE WILL BE ON THE COURSE?

Hamble School of Yachting's PST students come from all over the world and the school welcomes its diverse customer base. Students benefit from the knowledge, experience and cultural perspectives of a wide range of like minded individuals embarking on their sailing education. Hamble School of Yachting aims to ensure a small Instructor to student ratio in order to maximise individual development. Other than the distance sailing and self sail modules, students will normally be in a crew of no more than six including the instructor.

THE SAILING GROUND

Hamble School of Yachting's HQ is convenient for Southampton Water and the Solent, providing sheltered waters where training can continue in almost any weather conditions. In addition the Solent can offer a sample of almost every type of harbour and anchorage giving a rich variety of pilotage exercises and with large volumes of commercial, local and leisure traffic it provides excellent training opportunities and challenges.

The Solent is also an excellent base for the distance sailing segments of the programme giving access to the Isle of Wight, France and the Channel Islands. It also benefits from opportunities provided by the Dorset, Devon and Cornish harbours to the West and Sussex and Kent to the East. With easy access to these sheltered waters, combined with cruising grounds in three directions, sailing programmes are rarely constrained by weather and wind direction and this ensures that interesting, varied and challenging sailing will be delivered.

Due to the complex nature of the tides, and currents around the Isle of Wight, if you can safely navigate the Solent waters you can navigate anywhere in the world. The Needles Channel on a full spring ebb, with a south westerly force eight, is one of the most dangerous places in the world.





THE PST COURSE EXPLAINED

THE COMPREHENSIVE 17 WEEK PROGRAMME IS DIVIDED INTO THREE MODULES.

The total course spans 17 calendar weeks. This enables a series of short periods of intensive tuition with no time wasted, followed by brief rest periods.

Although this course is intensive, Hamble School of Yachting's aim is to build a student's confidence as well as their knowledge and experience. It is not a competition. If a student isn't ready to take their exam at the end of the school will be as accommodating as possible and try to organise additional training.

Each Module comprises a mixture of shore-based theory, taught in the onsite classroom, and practical sailing. It is an important aim of the course to accumulate sea miles, including skippered passages, necessary for the final RYA Yachtmaster Offshore qualification. Therefore, each practical session is ascribed a target mileage. Practical sailing sessions are specifically detailed either as dedicated distance sailing weeks or "drills and skills" weeks closer to home in the Solent area. It is a very important feature of a course such as this that there is a good mix of both types of sailing.

Distance sailing exposes students to longer passages offshore that will involve watch keeping routines, crossing busy shipping lanes and advanced passage planning. The "drills and skills" weeks will concentrate on short passages involving lots of pilotage exercises in to and out of different harbours coupled with lots of close quarter handling under sail and power.

Time will also be spent on emergency routines, fog navigation, rudderless sailing, spinnaker handling and sail trim. During all these practical sessions skippering skills are developed and student confidence grows. The student to instructor ratio on board the yachts for the "drills and skills" weeks will be 5:1 maximum. Instructors will hold detailed, personal de-briefing sessions with each student on completion of each exercise and also at the end of the week. Through this system the pace and emphasis of the course can be regulated for each individual student. Progress will be logged and monitored in the PST workbook that is issued at the start of the course.

RYA DAY SKIPPER

MODULE 1 WILL SEE STUDENTS PROGRESS TO ADVANCED RYA DAY SKIPPER LEVEL THROUGH A COMBINATION OF OFFSHORE SAILING AND YACHT MAINTENANCE TRAINING.

The emphasis is on boat handling and "line-of-sight" pilotage. The student will be introduced to the basic principles of navigation, chartwork, tides and practical meteorology.

This module takes students form the basics of crewing and living onboard a yacht through tot being a confident and competent RYA Day Skipper capable of planning, organising and leading inshore passages.

MODULE 2 STEPS UP A GEAR AND AIMS TO BRING STUDENTS TO AN ADVANCED RYA COASTAL SKIPPER LEVEL.

An RYA Coastal Skipper should have acquired the level of theoretical knowledge necessary for Yachtmaster.

Students will have progressed beyond RYA Day Skipper mainly in the sense of being capable of planning and skippering extended coastal passages of approximately 20 – 30 miles, using navigational (as opposed to pilotage) techniques, and at night if necessary. An RYA Coastal Skipper should be reasonably competent at boat handling in confined waters under power or sail.

The module starts with the shorebased RYA Coastal Skipper/Yachtmaster Theory course which takes the student beyond RYA Day Skipper theory level and onto the next level. More emphasis is placed on offshore passage planning, advanced tidal calculations and more in-depth knowledge of meteorology.

Once the theory element is completed, the rest of the module is dedicated to practical application of their newly-acquired knowledge and development of your boat handling skills under sail and power. Passage planning and passage making will be practiced outside the Solent area and across the Channel.

The incremental nature of this phase will see students develop in confidence and skill. They will be increasingly able to prepare and execute more demanding passages and utilise skills such as sailing onto/off moorings, departing/arriving in harbours under sail, night navigation and pilotage. By the end of the phase, students will be able to cope with issues such as engine failure and be able to proceed with a plan that brings the boat and her crew safely into port.

Towards the end of week 11 there will be an in-house assessment from either the Chief Instructor or another qualified examiner. This is in the style of a RYA Yachtmaster assessment. Not only does it provide students with an real assessment as to your personal development, but it also prepares students for the eventual RYA Yachtmaster Offshore assessment at the end of Module 3.

Two shorebased weekends see students complete the RYA Weather course, Elementary First Aid and Radar courses.

MODULE 3

RYA YACHTMASTER OFFSHORE

WITH COMMERCIAL ENDORSEMENT

MODULE 3 AIMS TO GET THE STUDENT TO RYA YACHTMASTER OFFSHORE LEVEL WITH COMMERCIAL ENDORSEMENT.

The gold standard of sailing qualifications, the RYA Yachtmaster Offshore should be able to do all those things expected of a RYA Coastal Skipper but better, for longer and under more adverse conditions.

There are three main objectives in Module 3:

- 1. The accumulation of sea miles through extended offshore sailing;
- Personal development as a skipper Students will have developed practical experience and confidence through extended offshore and coastal cruising;
- 3. Two weeks of intense exam preparation with a RYA Yachtmaster Instructor in the local area.

The extended sailing is achieved by means of a 19 day distance sail. The first seven days will be with an instructor with the remaining 12 days dedicated as a self sail period without an instructor. This sailing experience is crucial in allowing students to gain real offshore skippering experience and the all-important qualifying passages for the final examination.

Examiners have consistently noted that Hamble School of Yachting students are far more confident due to this real life experience.

There really is no substitute for real skippering experience at this stage in the course. Unlike some other fast track training providers, each student will take it in turn to skipper several passages of over 60 miles and most courses have so far achieved between 500 and 600 miles in an area covering the entire English Channel.

Following two days of leave, students return to start an intensive ten day exam preparation period prior to undertaking the RYA Yachtmaster Offshore assessment with an independent examiner. This ten day period will take the student right back through all areas of the syllabus and will focus very much on "skills and drills" involving lots of close quarters work under power and sail, night exercises, pilotage and skippering skills. The exam will begin on the Wednesday evening and each student will spend approximately 10-12 hours being examined, in blocks of 3-4 hours at a time.

USEFUL INFORMATION

+ HEALTH

It is important that all students appreciate that the PST course is an intensive programme. The practical sessions at sea can be physically arduous and mentally demanding. Students need to satisfy themselves that they have basic physical fitness. Students who intend to work commercially will need to satisfy themselves that they do not suffer from any medical condition that would preclude them from obtaining their commercial endorsement. + COMMERCIAL ENDORSEMENT

If students wish to work commercially with their RYA Yachtmaster qualification they must obtain a commercial endorsement to add to their ticket. Students will need to complete a medical with any UK registered doctor using the ML5 medical from, or via this link:

https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/ml5-medical-report-form-and-certificate-msf-4112

Please note that the ML5 medical is only valid for presentation to the RYA/MCA for endorsement for three months from the date of issue so for candidates completing all three modules it will be out of date by the end of the course necessitating another visit to the doctor! The school suggests that candidates who have any doubts about their general health or possible colour blindness they should definitely have a medical before the course and then another one within three months of the end of the course. It would be a shame to start and then discover something like colour blindness bars them from obtaining the commercial endorsement. Of course those candidates not intending to obtain a commercial endorsement do not require a medical.

Students will also be required to pass an online assessment known as the PPR (Professional Practices and Responsibilities course). Successful candidates will be able to print off a certificate.

To obtain the endorsement students will need to present the following to the examiner; PPR certificate, STCW Personal Survival Techniques (or equivalent) certificate, ML5 medical and a completed commercial endorsement form (available from the office) along with a fee for commercial endorsement processing.

+ PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE

Whereas acceptance for the course does not require any formal sailing qualifications, it is required that students have a minimum of 100 logged, tidal miles. These should ideally have been accumulated within a period reasonably close to the date when the PST course commences.

The reasons for this requirement are:

 The student will have some idea whether they are likely to enjoy sailing and so will start the course with "eyes open". 2. The RYA Yachtmaster Offshore qualification requires 2,500 logged sea miles. The course is designed to provide this mileage as a minimum, but a 100 miles pre-course requirement provides an additional "cushion" for example in case of ill health.

Hamble School of Yachting will be happy to organise these qualifying miles as preparation for a PST course, and this will also provide an opportunity for discussions with the student regarding their suitability for the PST course. It will normally require approximately one week of typical sailing school cruising to accumulate 100 sea miles.

Students who would like to gauge their suitability for the course can enlist on a Hamble School of Yachting training weekend, at the end of which the instructor will offer a friendly but honest assessment.

The school will not charge for this weekend and it will give prospective students the opportunity to see what is on offer and really gauge exactly what they want from their training.





+ BOOKS AND EQUIPMENT + DOCUMENTS AND

All books required for the course will be supplied at the start of each module with the G15 Log Book and RYA Competent Crew Course Notes being supplied on registration. However should students already have a G15 log book, they should bring it with them as proof of previous experience. The purchase of a Bretton Plotter, navigational dividers and drawing instruments is the student's responsibility. The school will provide students with a list of additional books which are recommended background reading when the course is booked.

+ CLOTHING

Clothing should be packed in a soft crew-bag (or sports bag). Each student should bring a sleeping bag, however the school can provide this if you are travelling from afar. The school provides quality, industry-leading Musto wet weather gear, however students are welcome to bring their own if they wish. The school is able to offer substantial discounts on the entire Musto range. Please seek the school's advice before spending money on this expensive kit. Students should bring warm clothing including thermal layers, woolly hat and sailing gloves. Students will also need to have a pair of deck shoes and sailing boots. Please feel free to call for advice if you would like more information on any of the above items. The marina has laundry and drying facilities.

MONEY

The practical cruising will include trips to France so students should bring a current passport. Non EU students should call the office for advice on visa requirements.

Money will be needed for:

- 1. Some food. All catering is included except on shorebased courses where only lunch is provided.
- 2. Mooring and marina fees. The costs for the mooring fees will be met by the School with the exception of the 12 day self-sail period in Module 3. This cost will be divided between the crew. Students should allow approximately £20 per cruising week. The idea of this is to encourage students into interesting mooring areas such as harbour walls or anchorages rather than expensive marinas!
- 3. Occasional visits to pubs / restaurants while cruising are at the crew's discretion. There really is nowhere to spend money at sea so don't bring too much!
- 4. Exam fees will be detailed during the course. Details are available on the RYA website.

MCA/STCW BASIC SAFETY TRAINING WEEK

A requirement for employment on superyachts, the MCA/STCW training week includes all of the components required for the Basic Training course.

- Personal Safety and Social Responsibilities
- Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting
- Personal Survival Techniques
- Elementary First Aid

NOTE: If completing in conjuration with the PST course, where Personal Survival and Elementary First Aid are included, only Personal Safety and Social Responsibility and Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting modules will be outstanding and the course time is reduced to three days.



RYA SHOREBASED OCEAN COURSE

This course provides all of the theoretical tuition on ocean passage making and astro navigation needed prior to setting off on an ocean passage as mate or skipper.



GMDSS RESTRICTED OPERATORS CERTIFICATE (ROC)

This course provides the necessary knowledge to pass the ROC Operators Licence which will enable the user to operate communications equipment in sea area A1. The ROC is required to upgrade to a Master of Yachts 200gt (up to 150mn from a safe haven) along with a RYA Yachtmaster Offshore Certificate of Competence, the Basic Safety Training Week and satisfactory completion of MCA oral examination.

GMDSS GENERAL OPERATORS CERTIFICATE (GOC)

This course provides the necessary knowledge to pass the GOC Operators Licence which will enable the user to operate communications equipment in sea areas A1, A2, A3 and A4 (worldwide). The GOC is required to upgrade to a Master of Yachts 200gt (unlimited area) along with a Yachtmaster Ocean Certificate of Competence, the MCA/STCW Proficiency in Medical Care Onboard Ship, the

Basic Safety Training Week and satisfactory completion of MCA oral examination.

MCA/STCW PROFICIENCY IN MEDICAL FIRST AID

This is a four day course covering diagnostics and medical management. This course cannot be undertaken without successful completion of MCA/STCW Elementary First Aid which is included in the PST programme.

MCA/STCW PROFICIENCY IN MEDICAL CARE ON BOARD SHIP

This is a five day course which moves on from the Medical First Aid course in that you will be introduced to the diagnosis, nursing and minor surgical procedures commonly required on a vessel offshore. The course cannot be undertaken without successful completion of the MCA/STCW Proficiency in Medical First Aid. Medical Care On Board Ship is a mandatory requirement for Ocean Yachtmasters operating in Category 1 (over 150 NM from a safe haven) and Category 0 (unrestricted) under the MCA Code of Practice.

INDUSTRY OPPORTUNITIES

HAMBLE SCHOOL OF YACHTING'S PST STUDENTS ARE WELL-EQUIPPED FOR EMPLOYMENT AROUND THE WORLD.

With a turnover in the UK alone in excess of two billion pounds, yachting is big business! Hamble School of Yachting trains people from all walks of life to become professional skippers.

Skippering yachts is a unique and rewarding career. As a yacht skipper you have ultimate responsibility for the vessel and everyone aboard. A yacht skipper needs to be able to draw upon a large number of technical and personal skills. As a skipper the rewards in terms of personal satisfaction are also huge.

There are many avenues available to the newly qualified yacht skipper and many will work in several different areas during the course of their careers. Broadly speaking the industry is split into two sectors, the yacht sector (that's yachts up to 24metres in length) and the supervacht sector (that's yachts over 24 metres). Work within the smaller yacht sector can include worldwide yacht deliveries, corporate entertainment, being a Flotilla Skipper for holiday companies, or even training to become a sailing instructor teaching various courses to students at sea schools such as Hamble School of Yachting. The common theme is that you will spend time away from home possibly abroad, have the opportunity to sail a varied range of boats and meet a huge variety of people. In the superyacht sector you would start off as a Deckhand and work your way up to Skipper over a period of time. Increasingly the superyacht sector is demanding a certain number of MCA/STCW qualifications.

Those qualifications are granted by the MCA as opposed to the RYA. Four basic qualifications are required to obtain the Basic Safety Training required on a superyacht. They are Elementary First Aid, Personal Survival Techniques, Personal Safety and Social Responsibilities and Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting. Hamble School of Yachting includes the first two within its standard PST programme, the other two are available as an extra module upon completion of the standard course.

Working on multi million pound superyachts in exotic locations such as the Caribbean and the Mediterranean can be a fantastic way of life and pay is generally very good with good career prospects. You will need to be prepared to work extremely hard and to have very high personal standards. The basic qualification required for any of these careers is the MCA/RYA Yachtmaster Offshore qualification and this is what students on the 17 week Professional Sail Training course achieve.
